

HELPFUL HINTS TO CUSTOMERS

Leaks are frequently the cause of excessive water bills. Toilet facilities are responsible for 75% of all leaks.

A small faucet drip will run 30 gallons daily, 900 gallons monthly. This leak will cost you \$2.48 in a month.

A leak the size of a pin, 1/32" will waste 170 gallons daily, 5100 gallons monthly, increasing your bill by \$12.45 in a month.

A leak 1/16" as large as a regular knitting needle will waste 970 gallons daily, 29,100 gallons monthly. This would cost you \$41.85 in a month.

A leak 1/8" in diameter will waste 3,600 gallons daily, 108,000 gallons monthly. This leak will cost \$120.75 in a month.

The above figures are in addition to a minimum water bill of \$7.00 Plus 4% State tax.



There are many common practices, which result in waste of water in the home. These practices, naturally, add unnecessarily to the cost of water bills.

Among such practices are the following:

1. Running the water continuously while shaving
2. Running continuously while washing dishes
3. Using the washing machine for light washes
4. Running the water until cold to get a drink
5. Running the water continuously while washing face and hands
Instead of using a stoppered lavatory for water
6. Allowing a faucet to drip or a seemingly small leak to continue
7. Improperly watering lawns and flowers

Avoiding these seemingly insignificant practices will help to keep your water bill down and prevent overtaxing of water supply facilities in the hot days of summer.
