

Council Minutes
May 13

On a roll after the repaving of South Main Street, the City of Headland is looking ahead to other prospective projects.

Mayor Ray Marler told the council CDBG Community Enhancement bids were due the next day. The funding would cover the re-paving of six streets in the city. He also said TAP funding applications have been sent, with hopes of receiving funds to handle sidewalk projects.

Discussion continued on the upcoming move to the former Alabama Power site on the square. City Clerk Crystal Gibson showed the council some examples of proposed signs for the building, adding more examples from other companies are expected.

The council approved \$2,406.21 for the purchase of a new ice maker for the city's fire department.

Marler praised Headland High's golf and softball teams for reaching their respective state playoffs.

Also on the subject of tournaments, there will be a Dixie Majors planning meeting May 22 at 6 p.m. The state tournament will start July 18, with Headland acting as host for the second consecutive year.

The HMS GREAT graduation will be held May 23, with sixth graders gathering at 8:15 a.m. and eighth graders at 9:15.
