

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

December 2, 2014

TIME: 6:00PM

The Council of the City of Headland was called to order in the City Hall on November 18, 2014 with the following members present: Ray Marler, Mayor; Councilmembers: James Williams, Jr., Jody Singleton, Michael Roland, Joe Falkner, and Kendrick Spurling.

Upon a motion by Falkner and a second by Roland, the Council voted as follows to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as read:

Motion carried unanimously.

Public Comments:

Chamber Director, Rhonda Harrison, reported that we had a successful Open House. She estimated 175 Kindergarteners were on the square for the tree decorating and caroling. Harrison also reported that Sundown Cinema (held Nov. 21st) had a large attendance. The Christmas Parade will be held Thursday, December 11th. The theme is “A Caroling Christmas Parade” in honor of the Grand Marshall, Carol Bedsole. Line-up will begin at 4:45 at Douglas Park with the parade beginning at 6pm. The route was changed this year; the route will end at the school and will include more residences.

Citizen of Headland, Sam Mancil, requested speed bumps on Boyton Street. Williams, Jr. stated the city would look into getting the bumps. Singleton stated that we may need to wait to have this included with the next street construction project.

Resolution 12-2014-A concerning obtaining PolyEngineering for the Engineering Services for the Todd Syrup Sewer Project were discussed. Upon a motion from Singleton and a second from Spurling the Resolution passed as read:
